Sir Rhys ap Thomas married (1) Eva, daughter of Henri ap Gwilym of Cwrt Henri, and (2) Janet, daughter of Thomas Mathew of Radyr, who was widow of Thomas Stradling of S. Donats. He died in 1525 and was buried in Greyfriars church, Carmarthen. His body was later removed to S. Peters church; the tomb there was restored in 1865.

Rhys ap Thomas was born the third son of Thomas ap Gruffydd, and would die the most powerful man in Wales. Neither birth order nor family would have predicted Rhys ' s rise to greatness. His paternal grandfather, Gruffydd ap Nicolas , had earned the family fortune, but the family was made more respectable by marriage when Rhys ' s father, Thomas ap Gruffydd, married the daughter of Sir John Gruffydd of Abermarlais .

Thomas Jones ' s father was a younger brother of Henry VII ' s supporter at Bosworth, Sir Rhys ap Thomas. Of the father ' s part in the Tudor cause little is recorded; he was almost certainly the man granted an annuity of 10 marks out of the exchequer at Carmarthen in 1487, perhaps as a reward for service two years before.
