The Atrocity Exhibition is an experimental novel of linked stories or "condensed novels" by British writer J. G. Ballard . The book was originally published in the UK in 1970 by Jonathan Cape. After a 1970 edition by Doubleday & Company had already been printed, Nelson Doubleday, Jr. personally cancelled the publication and had the copies destroyed, fearing legal action from some of the celebrities depicted in the book.
